#### INTRODUCTION

#### Historical Note

Following the publication of his short novel *One Day in the Life of Ivan Denisovich* in 1962, Aleksandr Solzhenitsyn was met with suspicion and resistance upon his attempts to publish further works in the Soviet Union. His next novel, *Cancer Ward*, was denied publication pending excision of perceived anti-Soviet insinuations, and the author was increasingly harassed by the KGB, who seized many of his papers.

Thus when Solzhenitsyn completed *The First Circle* in the mid-1960s, he attempted to make the fiercely anti-Soviet work more palatable to censors by cutting almost ten chapters' worth of material. The manuscript, however, was still rejected. Out of options in the USSR, the author converted the shortened manuscript to microfilm and smuggled the book to West Germany. The first Russian edition of *The First Circle*, containing only 87 chapters, appeared in the West in 1968, followed soon after by an English version, translated by Thomas Whitney and published by Harper & Row.

A complete, 96-chapter version of *The First Circle* was published in Russian in the West in 1978, but an English translation did not follow until 2009.

## History of the Papers and Their Organization

In 1992, the A. Solzhenitsyn *The First Circle* Mansucripts were donated to the Amherst Center for Russian Culture by Thomas Whitney, AC Class of 1937.

#### DESCRIPTION OF THE COLLECTION

#### Scope and Content Note

The A. Solzhenitsyn *The First Circle* Manuscripts consist of photocopies of the original Russian manuscript, a typescript blown up from microfilm smuggled out of Russia by the author, three copies of the first edition of *The First Circle*, and an uncorrected proof of an English translation of *The First Circle*.

#### Organization and Arrangement

The A. Solzhenitsyn *The First Circle* Manuscripts are organized into two series:

- 1. Manuscript photocopies (no date)
- 2. Publisher's materials (1968)
  - Sub-Series 1: Uncorrected proof for English translation (1968)
  - Sub-Series 2: Copies of first edition (n.d.)

# **Series Descriptions**

**Series 1, MANUSCRIPT PHOTOCOPIES** (**n.d.**) contains photocopies of Solzhenitsyn's original typescript (blown up from microfilm) – includes one complete copy, one incomplete copy of poor quality, and miscellaneous fragments and duplicates.

### Series 2, PUBLISHER'S MATERIALS (1968)

<u>Sub-Series 1: Uncorrected proof for English translation</u> – Thomas Whitney's personal copy of the proof for his own translation.

<u>Sub-Series 2: Copies of first edition</u> – contains three copies of the first edition of *The First Circle* in Russian (title misspelled by the publisher).
